1860: Benjamin Button born in Baltimore (1, ch. I);

apparent age: about 70 (7, ch. I)

1861-1865: American Civil War

1865: BB sent to kindergarten but is removed (19, ch. III)

age: 5 (19, ch. III)

1878: BB becomes freshman at Yale but has to leave (ch IV)

age: 18 (21, ch IV)

apparent age: about 50 [52] (21, ch IV)

1880: BB works for father, meets and marries Hildegarde Moncrief (ch. V; 32, ch. VII)

age: 20 (25, ch. V)

apparent age: about 50 (25, ch. V)

1881: BB's son Roscoe is born (34; ch. VII)

1895: BB's father retires after Benjamin doubles family fortune; BB's 35-year-old wife ceases to attract him (32, 34, ch. VII)

· age: [35]

apparent age: [35]

1898-1908: After father's business fails, father works as a salesman for Procter and Gamble.

family lives in Buffalo and Syracuse, New York

mother's inheritance sustains the family

1898: Spanish-American War

BB enlists and is promoted to lieutenant-colonel (35, ch. VII)

· age: [38]

apparent age: about 30 [32] (36, ch. VIII)

Twentieth Century (1900s)

Twentieth Century (1900s)

1906-1909: BB masters popular dances, mistaken for his son Roscoe (38-39, ch. VIII)

age: [46-49]

· apparent age: [24-21]

Roscoe's age: [25-28]

1896: Fitzgerald born in St. Paul, Minnesota

1910: Roscoe takes over the business, BB goes to Harvard (39-40, ch. IX)

- age: 50 (40, ch. IX)
- apparent age: about 20 (40, ch. IX)

1913-1918: Fitzgerald attends Princeton (briefly drops out and returns)

1914: BB graduates from Harvard and moves in with his son, Roscoe (41, ch. IX)

- age: [54]
- apparent age: 16 (41, ch. IX)

1917: United States enters World War I

- Fitzgerald commissioned as second lieutenant
- War ends (1918) shortly before he is expected to be sent overseas

1918-1919: Fitzgerald falls in love with Zelda Sayre, but she will not marry him until he is financially secure

1920: *This Side of Paradise* published; Fitzgerald marries Zelda Sayre

1921: Fitzgerald's only child, a daughter called Scottie (Frances Scott Fitzgerald), is born

1922: "The Curious Case of Benjamin Button" published

1924: Zelda has an affair with a French aviator

1925: *The Great Gatsby* published; Fitzgerald meets Ernest Hemingway

1930: Zelda has first nervous breakdown

1934: Tender Is the Night published

1938: Fitzgerald tells his daughter that marrying her mother was a mistake

1940: Fitzgerald dies

1917: United States enters World War I

- BB commissioned as brigadier-general, but not allowed to serve as general (44-48, ch. X)
- age: 57 (44, ch. X)
- apparent age: 15 (43, ch. IX)

1920: Roscoe's first child born (48, ch. XI)

- BB's age: [60]
- BB's apparent age: 10 (48, ch. XI)

1925: BB goes to kindergarten with his grandson (49, ch. XI)

- · age: [65]
- apparent age: [5]

c. 1930: BB loses his memory

- age: [70]
- apparent age: [newborn]
