## Zora Neale Hurston (1891-1960)

1891: Born in Alabama to John (carpenter and Baptist preacher) and Lucy (former schoolteacher)

1920: Receives associate degree from Howard University

1925-7: Studies anthropology at Barnard College with the "father of American anthropology," Franz Boas

### 1926:

- · Starts field work for Boas in Harlem
- · Produces the literary magazine *Fire!* with author Langston Hughes and others, but they publish only one issue

### 1927:

- · Collects folklore in Florida
- · Marries Herbert Sheen
- · Publishes article on St. Augustine, Florida in the Journal of Negro History

1928: Receives bachelor of arts degree from Barnard College

1930-1: Collaborates on the play *Mule Bone* with Langston Hughes, but they part ways over a dispute about authorship

### 1931:

- · Publishes "Hoodoo in America" in the Journal of American Folklore
- · Divorces Herbert Sheen

1934: Publishes the novel Jonah's Gourd Vine

1935: Receives a fellowship for a PhD in anthropology at Columbia University, but seldoms comes to class; does not continue in the program

1936: Receives Guggenheim Fellowship to study Obeah (folk magic and religion) in the West Indies, goes to Jamaica

## 1937:

- · Goes to Haiti
- · Writes and publishes Their Eyes Were Watching God

## 1939:

- · Receives honorary Doctor of Letters degree from Morgan State College
- · Marries Albert Price III
- · Becomes drama instructor at North Carolina College for Negroes (now North Carolina Central University) in Durham, and meets playwright Paul Green, a professor of drama at the University of the North Carolina

## 1940:

- · Files for divorce from Albert Price
- · Collects folklore in South Carolina

#### 1943:

- · Honored by Howard University as one of their Distinguished Alumni
- · Granted divorce from Albert Price
- 1947-8: Performs research in British Honduras
- 1950: Works as a maid
- 1956-7: Works as a librarian
- 1958: Works as a substitute teacher
- 1959: Suffers a stroke, reluctantly enters welfare home
- 1960: Dies, buried in unmarked grave
- 1973: Author Alice Walker finds and marks Hurston's grave
- 1975: Walker renews public interest in Hurston with an article in Ms.
